1. Teachers know their students and how they learn

[REDACTED] showed students a YouTube summary of the play which was enjoyable, and which students responded positively to.

2. Teachers know their subject content and how to teach that content to their students

[REDACTED] demonstrated a very good knowledge of Macbeth and the key concerns of the play.

3. Teachers plan for and implement effective teaching and learning

Macbeth poster activity: group work. Students to categorise posters according to theme. They identify the theme. This activity would have been a great way to introduce the unit on Macbeth. The boys later refined a paragraph they had written

on Macbeth, focusing on ensuring that they had ample evidence and that they analysed the evidence they provided, a very useful exercise in the lead up to the exam.

4. Teachers create and maintain supportive and safe learning environments

[REDACTED] enables all students to participate in the learning activity. Don't be afraid to be assertive when addressing the class and managing behaviour.

5. Teachers assess, provide feedback and report on student learning
