

## Peer-Editing Worksheet

**Have a look through the following questions (individually) and revise your speech accordingly.**

### **Questions to Consider (A simple yes/no exercise):**

*If you answer 'no' to any of the questions below you will need to identify why this is the case and ask your peer to make appropriate adjustments.*

- 1) Does the speech answer the question in the introduction? Would the audience be able to identify the purpose of the speech?
- 2) Does the response and language show regard for audience (i.e. is it appropriately pitched)?
- 3) Has your peer captured the audience's attention in the introduction with enough information that he/she can tell the speech's purpose?
- 4) Has your peer included a strong thesis statement?
- 5) Has your peer used specific examples to support the thesis logically?
- 6) Has your peer created topic sentences that support each of their main ideas?
- 7) Has your peer thoroughly developed each main idea by a sufficient number of well elaborated supporting details? Has your peer used details in the proper order to support each main idea logically?
- 8) Has your peer included any unnecessary details, which they should delete now?
- 9) Has your peer consistently used either third or first person point of view?
- 10) Has your peer included appropriate and purposeful vocabulary?
- 11) Has your peer used transitional phrases to connect their ideas coherently (e.g. 'In addition', 'Furthermore', 'Moreover' etc.
- 12) Has your peer drawn a reasonable conclusion as a summation of the details they have used?
- 13) Has your peer used correct grammar and syntax?
